The goal of the workshop is to offer principals a hands-on experience with the tools in the Standards Aligned System (SAS) as a resource for impacting student learning. The conference will answer the question, “What does SAS offer and how can I use it as a building leader?”

During the first day of the workshop, principals will work with the resources and tools available through SAS and explore how SAS can be used by classroom teachers and students. This will include assessment tools, learning progressions, district curriculum mapping tools, and other resources that teachers can use in their programs. Each principal can create and moderate an electronic SAS Professional Learning Community for their buildings to support the use of SAS with their staff. A focus of the day will be to show how SAS can support and enhance current programs, school goals, district initiatives, and quality instruction.

On the second day, the principals will use case studies and scenarios to explore and share how SAS can be used to help solve curriculum issues, meet instructional goals, and improve school and community dialogue around student learning. The day will conclude with a highlight of upcoming applications in SAS and how the Department of Education envisions SAS supporting Common Core Standards, the Keystone Exams, professional development, and working with data sources.
