

Twentieth Century America has supported two special art forms that have been adopted by virtually all of the people: motion pictures and comic art. The daily experience of most of us includes the enjoyment of comic strips.

The newspaper industry has promoted daily comic strips by the tens of millions of copies each day and added special sections in color to Sunday editions. From animation sequences to complicated adventures and social serials, comic strips hold the attention of most newspaper readers.

Although the public enjoys comic strips every day, the average reader doesn't appreciate the creative talent and craft that goes into each panel. The cartoonist must develop story lines and sequences for the strip that will capture the interest and loyalty of the readers. These themes must be represented by drawings that are simple enough to be easily recognized by the juvenile audience, yet stylish enough for even the most sophisticated devotees.

Typically, the cartoonist serves as writer and artist, blending his skills and imagination to produce a significant and, often, topical art form — one that receives almost instantaneous distribution and widespread circulation.

The Sordoni Art Gallery, at Wilkes College, is pleased to display a sample of American Comic Strip Art. Headlining the show are major examples by Alex Raymond and Hal Foster. Raymond and Foster are generally considered to be the best of the comic art illustrators. Of local interest and significance, is an extremely rare daily strip by Ham Fisher. Fisher created the character of JOE PALOOKA while working in Wilkes-Barre and most of the scenes in the strip have Wyoming Valley as a background.

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
