John Ramsey

John Ramsey — a life-long resident of Wilkes-Barre, graduated from St. Mary's High School in the class of 1929. A retired surveyor and draftsman, Ramsey is self-taught as an artist, working on paper with pencil and watercolor to create intricately detailed scenes. His subjects combine history and imagination and are often drawn from sources such as vintage postcards and old photo albums.

Ramsey's small paintings have been related to Naive Folk Art and they are indeed unaffected in their ingeneous and unpretentious simplicity. His landscapes show his interest in outdoor life and indicate the influence of his favorite American artists, Theodore Robinson and William Merritt Chase. The many familiar scenes from the Wyoming Valley reveal Ramsey's deep love of the region and his collage-like technique exhibits the fanciful wit and charm of a story-teller.

A member of the Wyoming Valley Art League, Ramsey has exhibited his work locally for several years.

Betsy Fulton — a native of the Wilkes-Barre area, completed a BFA in printmaking at the Tyler School of Art in Philadelphia. She was then associated with the Dallmann Printmaking Workshop where etchings and lithographs were pulled for artists in New York City and Philadelphia. In 1974 Fulton accepted a teaching assistantship at the Tyler School of Art in Rome, Italy. She is currently Project Director of The Institute for Human Resources and Services in Wilkes-Barre.

The importance of line in Fulton's work is in part a consequence of her background. Recent paintings in casein show the printmaker's technique of building layer upon layer of colored lines, at once creating a sense of structural mass and a richly activated surface. The painstaking process is a method of channeling the creative energy of the artist.

Fulton's subjects are often children, among their playthings or in closely cropped portraits, who show signs of being already very grown up. Other images spring from nature and reveal a search for strength in things as unpretentious as rocks. In any form, her work evokes a physical sensation of feeling causing no viewer to walk by unaffected.
